## **MOVING FORWARD**

We are gradually returning to normal learning programs with our attendance now over 90%. While the Department for Education has been supporting parent choice during this pandemic, we now expect all students who are well and not considered vulnerable to COVID-19 to attend school.

Students are required to attend school unless they are:

- Feeling unwell •
- Have a chronic medical condition or compromised immune system and are not able to • attend school on advice from their medical practitioner
- Live in a household with others that are deemed vulnerable to COVID-19 and are not able to attend school on advice of their medical practitioner
- Have been diagnosed with COVID-19 or have been required to self-isolate by SA Health.

Please contact the office to extend your child's 'home learning.' Please note that extensions can on be granted with an accompanying Dr's letter which clearly outlines the associated risks. All other absences will be followed up as per Department for Education requirements.

We thank parents and caregivers for adhering to our restrictions and remind you that they still apply until further notice. Only come onto the school grounds if absolutely necessary and if you are waiting outside of the school grounds, please keep 1.5m away from adults and children by not crowding around entrances.



## It's an online world!

Children today have access to a myriad of different online websites, applications and online games. There is an unprecedented amount of personal information available on these sites, which makes children both vulnerable and susceptible to others. Other identified dangers include exposure to inappropriate content, cyberbullying and harassment, exchange of inappropriate images and



identity theft. Children, especially Teenagers, are often not aware that their words and or images, which may have been intended for a small audience, sometimes find their way to a larger one, often with both unexpected and undesirable consequences.

We can't take the internet away from our children, this is the world they are entering into, but it is our responsibility as parents and educators to teach our children how to use the internet responsibly. This includes how to protect themselves, how to interact with others and as parents to monitor our children's use and access to the internet. Just like all areas of a child's education, we encourage parents to be involved in their children's lives and discuss what they are doing, what they are using an app or website for, how they interact with others and discuss the realities of being a global citizen in an online environment.

For information on how to put in place restrictions on your own home wifi, I recommend contacting your Internet Service Provider. They will be able to talk you through how to go into your own settings and put controls in place for access to sites.

While you're putting restrictions in place for online access for your children, don't forget your live streaming networks such as Netflix and Stan. These have the ability to restrict access to programs with unsuitable content too.

In all instances it is our responsibility as parents to not only protect our children but to educate them about appropriate use of online websites and applications. Consider the social and emotional maturity of your child along with their age in years, and most importantly keep talking with your child.

Open communication and being aware of what your child is doing is the most effective way to support them as they grow and navigate new opportunities as they present.



We recommend that all parents and carers are aware of what applications are currently on their child's device. The applications listed above all have minimum age requirements of at least 12 years of age to access the applications. Even if your child does meet the age requirements, it does not necessarily mean they are socially and emotionally ready to communicate and share in these environments. We do not recommend any of the above apps for children 12 years or younger and for those older, we recommend extreme caution.
