SAFE AND ENGAGING LEARNING AT SCHOOL


While we welcome the easing of restrictions and are grateful to be in South Australia which is in such a positive place regarding COVID-19 we are also aware that the pandemic is not over and that we are all still managing a situation that could change at any time.

Although restrictions have eased considerably there are still many precautions in place at school:

- Additional handwashing and sanitising of surfaces
- No parents in buildings
- Parents asked to spend minimal time on school site
- No face to face meetings – unless deemed necessary by leadership and then complying with strict social distancing guidelines
- Modified reports due to the difficulty of gaining accurate assessments of student work
- Assemblies held via video links to classrooms
- Minimising the number of external people on site eg private service providers
- Sending students and staff home who attend with cold and flu symptoms.

We thank you for your support and understanding as we continue to provide a safe and engaging learning environment for your children.






STUDENT SAFETY ON ADELAIDE STREET



We want all of our students to be safe during the very busy periods and encourage all parents and caregivers to follow and abide by all road and parking regulations. Some simple guidelines for keeping everyone safe are:

- Observe the 25KM/H speed limit for the entire length of Adelaide Street
- Do not park and leave your vehicle whilst the drop off / pick up zone is in operation. Burnside Council parking officers regularly patrol and issue fines
- Do not let children get out of or in the car whilst stopped in the middle of the street. Exiting from the left hand side of the vehicle is the safest side.
- Do not stop at the crossing to drop off or pick up students
- Move as far forward as possible when pulling into the drop off / pick up zone. This will stop cars zig-zagging in and out
- Exercise extreme caution when reversing. Better still, don't do it!
- Do not hold up traffic whilst waiting for a spot. This causes major issues on Penfold Road. Go around the block instead.



A teacher is on duty until 3:25pm and will escort any remaining children to the office. We all need to do our bit to keep our kids safe.

KAT EDSON - PASTORAL CARE WORKER

I recently attended a seminar about eSafety run by the eSafety Commissioner. The seminar outlined the importance of online safety, the ways we can teach our children to act appropriately online and what to do if they experience or witness inappropriate material. In a time where access to the internet is of high demand the amount of time we spend online has increased. It has become even more important that we continue to monitor our children's online use. Children should not be deterred from accessing the online world, or feel suspicious when using the internet. It is important that we model a safe culture and standard of behaviour and age appropriate access for our children.

A valuable insight from the seminar was an appreciation of the variety of information for parents, children and young people that can be found on the eSafety Commissioner website. For example how to talk with your child about what they may experience when online; helpful information about current trending apps and their potential dangers.

The website does not just focus on social media but also has information about online gaming platforms and their potential issues. There is also a child friendly section to help children learn about positive online behaviour, internet use protective behaviours and what they can do if they feel unsafe online. Mindful of the current situation and in consultation with the school, MSP Photography will be instigating a new process for the taking of school photos this year. This new process has been designed in accordance with the most recent guidelines currently issued by SA Health and are being monitored daily.

This year the format for school photos will change to a composite style.

- What this means is that each student will be photographed individually and the group created digitally as a composite. This will eliminate the need for students to be bunched together in close contact with either themselves or our staff.
- Students will move in and out of the portrait studio area individually.
- The area will be set up in such a way as to ensure that each individual student will maintain the recommended social distancing guidelines of 1.5m from other students and the photographer.
- MSP Photography staff will provide instructions to each class upon entry to the photography area.
- Hygiene and cleaning guidelines used by MSP Photography staff are in accordance with information distributed by SA Health.

As per all recommendations, if your child is unwell there is no need to send them on photo day. MSP Photography will provide a catch up session for students who may be absent on photo day.
