One of the positives about the current situation is that everyone has had to find and learn new ways to achieve goals and outcomes. Our Magill School Community should be proud of the way that we have been able to adapt to meet the new normal. As we start to plan to ease restrictions, it's a great opportunity for us to reflect on the past few months and identify what's worked well and what we want to keep. Some things that come to mind are:



- The greater standard of hygiene practices and expectations whereby sick staff and students stay home until they are well
- The independent skills that many of our JP students have developed by having to organise themselves for their learning each morning and pack up at the end of the day, without parent assistance.
- The morning routine which has enabled teachers to quickly settle their students and commence the day's learning program.

Our current restrictions will remain for the remainder of the term and we will distribute information about Term 3 in the next week or so.

In the spirit of finding new ways to do things, our Year 7 Leaders and Mike Shortt (Year 4 teacher) have produced a video to replace the tours that our Year 7 Leaders would normally lead each term. It is now live on our school website and I'm positive that you will be impressed. Well done to all involved for their part in what is a fabulous advertisement for our school.

As previously mentioned, due to the high absenteeism of both students and teachers during the COVID -19 pandemic and the inconsistent nature of learning programs, the midyear report has been modified.

Grades have been assigned primarily by teacher judgement based on what they have been able to assess for each individual child, not the entire learning program.


Maths and English comments are predominantly focussed on curriculum content. Teachers have individualised comments where they feel they have sufficient information to do so.


