#### SAPSASA BOYS KNOCKOUT CRICKET

After having to wait over 2 terms to play our first matches, the Boys Knockout SAPSASA Cricket Team finally had their chance. In a new format, we were to play two T20 matches against East Adelaide and Marryatville.

Our first match against East Adelaide was played in good spirits, with East Adelaide winning the toss and batting first. Immediately bringing pressure, early maidens and wickets had East Adelaide at 2/9 after 4

overs. Tight bowling, fielding, consistent motivation and communication meant the run rate was consistently low across the entire innings. Wickets fell steadily until the 12th over when Nate (F2) was introduced into the attack. In an incredible show of line and length medium-pace bowling Nate finished with the astonishing figures of 5/2 (2.1), including wickets with the first two balls of his spell. Ultimately East Adelaide were bowled out for 35 in the 16th over.

Discipline from our openers, Aayan (F1), 12\* and Xavier (F5) 12\*, saw us chase down the total in the 6th over. In a great show of sportsmanship, EA agreed to let the remaining batters have a hit, with all batsmen registering at least one run. Special mention to Ghazi (F15) for an entertaining 23, including two BIG sixes.

After a short break, Marryatville won the toss and elected to bowl. This match saw a significant step up in the quality of play, with low totals for extras and tighter bowling from the opposition. Again, our openers gave us a strong start, guiding the team to 0/32 after 6 overs. Xavier (F5) in particular showed discipline and control on his way to 25\* and eventually retired after 12 overs of batting. Following his departure, we lost regular wickets until our final partnership between Thomas (F14) and Nate (F2) saw us reach 7/87 with 12 coming from the final 2 overs.

With the ball we started in strong fashion, having Marryatville 1/26 from 10 overs. Once more, our fielding and 'chat' were positive, keeping the pressure on. From that point the fall of a few wickets saw Marryatville pick up the pace. A couple of chances went begging and a few lucky shots found their way to the boundary. Despite some strong bowling from Rohail (F1) with 3/10 (4) and Oscar (F4) with 0/7 (3) the match hung in the balance. With 2 overs to go Marryatville required 16 runs. Unfortunately for us, they were able to chase down our total, finishing on 6/93.
