With our Learning Conversations now completed, I'd like to acknowledge the amazing job that our staff did to manage the health risks associated with opening the school up to a large number of visitors. We continue to maintain a positive and engaging learning environment despite the fact that COVID-19 health and hygiene restrictions remain in place. It seems like these restrictions will some time to come and will pose organising and running school events. Whilst we are confident that students will continue to participate in a variety of school events and programs, parent and caregiver participation remains a challenge for us. In the coming weeks we will trial a limited number of parents attending our assemblies. Further information will be distributed via class teachers and attendance will be limited to parents of those classes presenting at the assembly.

Next week, parents and caregivers from Reception to Year 6 will receive a 2021 class placement form which will need to be completed this term.
