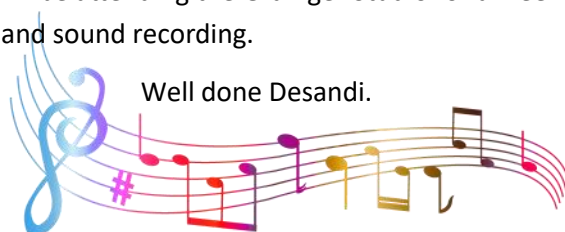


## FESTIVAL OF MUSIC ORCHESTRA 2020

## BOYS SAPSASA KNOCKOUT FOOTBALL

It was fantastic to see a record number of students register interest to participate in SAPSASA Football this year. Across year 6 and 7, a total of 58 students worked on developing their skills and having fun along the way to compete in the round-robin knockout competitions held during weeks 2 and 3 of this term.

First up were the Girls, competing against Trinity Gardens, Greenwith and Walkerville Schools in fantastic conditions. With only a handful of players having actually competed in football previously, our goal as a team was to make improvement across each quarter.

I'm pleased to say that although the scoreboard wasn't in our favour, as a team we were able to achieve this goal. The team improved their ball movement and overall attack on the contest, making a number of strong plays from defence to attack in each of the matches and increasing the number of effective tackles.

We may not have won on the day, but I cannot speak highly enough of the commitment and positive attitudes displayed by all members of the squad. A special mention to **Georgia F5**, **Alana F2** and **Liana F2** for their consistent play and midfield drive across all 3 matches.

The Magill Boys SAPSASA Football team competed against Walkerville and Burnside schools on the Wednesday of Week 3. Similarly to the girls, we had a number of first-time players and others who had only participated in SAPSASA in 2019.

We went into the day with anticipation, open minds and nerves-a-plenty, attacking our first match against Walkerville with positivity and controlled aggression. A close game from start to finish, it took right until the last kick to determine a winner - Magill.

It was evident that we played our 'Grand Final' in our first match, as the second took a different turn. Playing against a more experienced and taller side, Burnside were too strong. The boys fought valiantly, stemming the tide a little in the third quarter, but ultimately it wasn't enough. Burnside progressed to the second phase.

Pleasingly, this day was one of those where 'all played well', particularly given our lack of experience. Special mentions to Year 7s, **Eann F4** and **Oscar F4** and Year 6s **Connor F5** and **Joel F12**, who all displayed leadership and flair in both matches.

Overall I am extremely proud of the efforts from all players across both competitions. Their dedication to training and eagerness to put feedback into play were fantastic. Hopefully there are a few new footballers among us. I look forward to seeing what football at Magill will look like in 2021.
