This term looks particularly busy with events planned that were not able to be done earlier this year as well as those which always occur in Term 4. Please keep an eye on the school calendar.

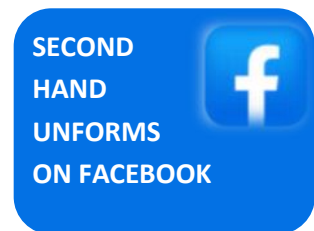
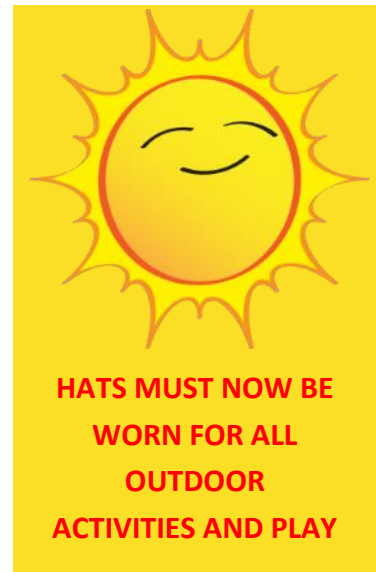

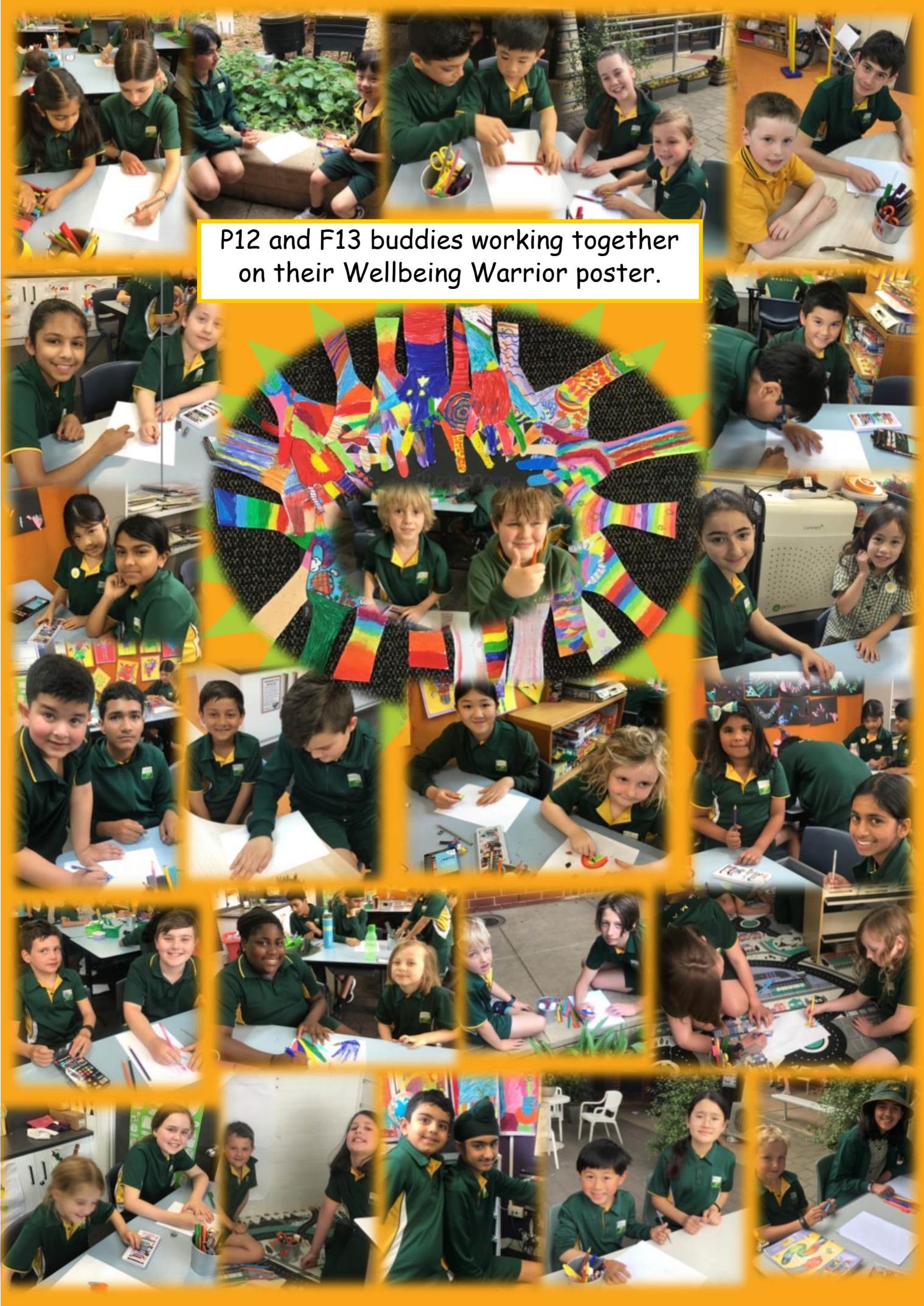
