Way to Go!



Through 2019 and 2020 our Way to Go Student Action Team has been working in collaboration with the Department for Transport and Infrastructure to support our students and their families to ride, scooter or walk to school safely, reducing the vehicle traffic around our already very busy school site.

As part of this collaboration we were fortunate to receive a financial grant this year to improve and add to our bike and scooter racks. We have also received new signage which features along the boundary fencing and at the safe crossings to our school.

The Way to Go Student Action Team are continuing to promote our new bike and scooter racks by running a raffle prize each week for those students who are using the new racks.

Important!

- When using the safe crossings to our school always walk your bike or scooter across the road
- When in the school grounds walk your bike or scooter to the racks – no riding in the grounds
- Use an appropriate bike or scooter lock and LOCK UP YOUR RIDE!

It is imperative that each student locks their bike or scooter to the rack and does this each and every time that they use the racks. If your child does not know how to use a bike/scooter lock, please take the time to show them how to do it.

Why not ride or scoot to school with your child over the weekend, remind them of the safe ways to cross busy roads, walk their bike or scooter through the school grounds and then come and practice locking their bike or scooter up in the new racks along the Adelaide Street side of our school.

Our partnership with the Way to Go program continues in 2021 as we welcome the BikeEd program to our school, continuing to educate students on safe ways to use our roads when on their bike or scooter.

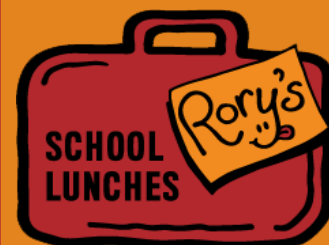

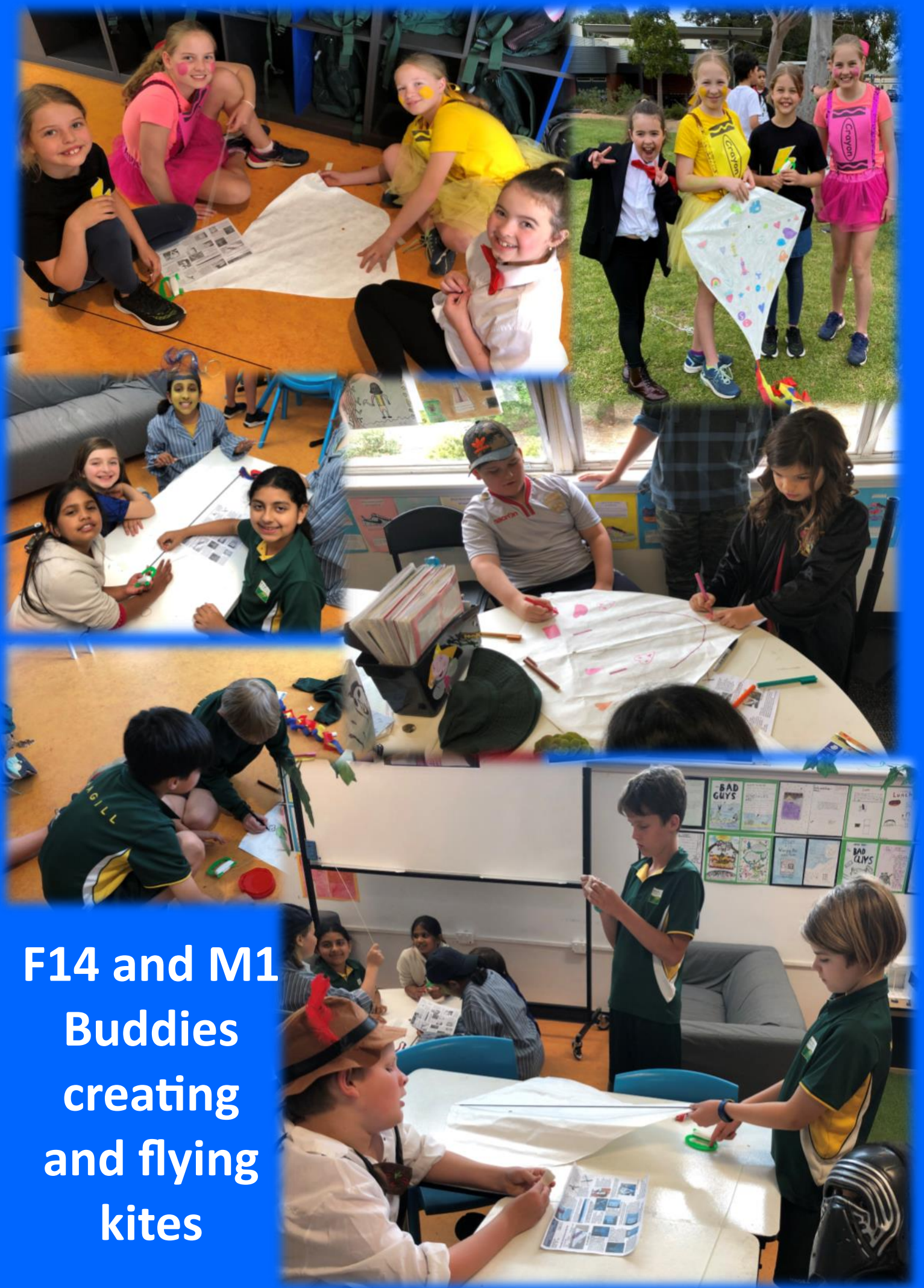
