



UNIFORM POLICY

The wearing of school uniform is compulsory for all students attending Magill School. Our Governing Council considers that uniform encourages pride in our school and helps children feel part of the Magill community. It also helps our parents to avoid competitiveness in student clothing.

Implementation procedures

- All students and parents are informed of the school's uniform policy on enrolment and asked for their support.
- The uniform policy is reinforced by staff including communication through newsletters, assemblies, parent meetings and school activities. When appropriate, this may involve students being requested to remove an unsuitable article or changing into school uniform.
- Students are required to wear official school uniform on ALL school excursions (unless otherwise notified).
- Students are required to wear official school uniform when representing the school.
- Wide brimmed hats must be worn during Term 1 and 4 during school hours.
- Clothing items should be clearly labelled with names to ensure lost items can be returned.
- Stickers will be issued to students by teachers when out of uniform. These stickers are to be placed in student diaries as a reminder to families.

Exemptions

The principal may exempt students from the dress code upon written request from parents. Grounds for exemption are:

- Religious, cultural or ethnic reasons
- New or itinerant students
- Medical reason
- Any other grounds as the Governing Council may determine

New uniform transition

The review and outsourcing of Magill uniform items and sales occurred in 2017. A transition to the new uniform will take place over a two year period commencing in 2018. During this time we encourage families to purchase the new uniform (as indicated under dress code) when replacing any items. This will ensure a cost effective transition to school consistency.

Financial hardship

Where financial hardship impacts on uniform, it is recommended that families approach the school Leadership Team so that supports may be implemented.

Uniform shop

UMS are suppliers of Magill uniform. Orders can be made directly through the school uniform shop, at other UMS supply locations (Norwood) or online. Lay-by and second hand options are available.

Year 7 uniform:

As outlined above, with the optional inclusion of a Magill Year 7 jumper. This jumper will be offered once per year.

School bags:

Bottle green logo bags are required for all students at Magill.

Accessories:

All permitted accessories are to be in school colours i.e. green, gold and white

- Hair accessories
- Skivvies or t-shirts worn under clothing

Accessories not permitted include:

- Body piercings. Single basic studs or sleepers may be worn in ears.
- Wristbands, unless in line with school fundraising.
- Nail polish and acrylic nails.
- Extreme hair colour and styles. Natural tones of blonde, brown, and red are acceptable.
- Caps.
- Make-up. Students will be asked to remove it.
- Tracksuit pants and leggings under school dresses. Tight fitting bike shorts are permissible under dresses, providing they are in school colours and are not visible.

Watches and earrings (as outlined above) are the only jewellery to be worn at school

Footwear:

- Plain white socks
- Students may wear traditional black school shoes to school. During winter or wet weather, brown boots are acceptable.
- Standard 'runners' will be permitted, providing they are predominantly coloured white or black (apart from small logo). Skate shoes or converse style 'runners' are not permitted.
- Footwear worn at school must have thick outer soles and closed toes; suitable for a range of activities i.e. sandals are non-compliant.
- Shoelaces must be either white or black, in line with shoe colouring.
